Regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Isle of Palms, S.C. Jan. 9th. 1957
Alderman Lempesis absent.

Retiring Mayor Herbert T. Louden opened meeting with 30 seconds of silent prayer, and then gave an account of the accomplishments during his term of office years 1955 and 1956; copy of address attached, including recommendation.

Mr. Louden then turned over the chair to the incoming Mayor Salvador V. Settile. Mayor Settile congratulated Mr. Louden on the grand work and accomplishments some of which will be remembered for many years to come.

Mayor Settile then read the appointments for all Officers and Committees also Commissions and Boards which he recommended; upon motion by Alderman Lamb 2nd by Alderman Blair the appointments were unanimously approved copy of all appointments ~~copy of appointments~~ attached. The following officers sworn in by Mayor Settile; W.G. Horne, Clerk-Treas. H.T. Louden Recorder and James H. Bremer, Corp. Councillor. Mayor Settile read a prayer which had the endorsement of 9 clergymen and recommended that the prayer be used at the ~~same~~ opening of all Council meetings in lieu of the thirty seconds of silent prayer which is now the custom, upon motion by Alderman Blair seconded by Alderman Rumph the recommendation was unanimously carried.

Mayor Settile recommended that ~~the~~ Special Committees be appointed to investigate Mosquito Control, Sidewalks, ^{and} term of office be 4 years instead of two for all members of the Council. The recommendation was unanimously carried upon motion by Alderman Blair seconded by Alderman Rumph.

Alderman Lempesis was appointed Chairman Mosquito Control with Alderman Rumph and Alderman Edwards, and Mayor Settile stated he would appoint the other two committees next meeting.

Clerk was instructed to have bond executed for Recorder Herbert T. Louden.

A motion by Alderman Blair seconded by Alderman Rumph that the City pay a salary of \$ 50.00 per month to the Recorder was unanimously carried.

Mr. Louden advised that Construction Foreman Shriver of the Playground had been released as of Jan. 1st. account no money to get material for repairs etc, and Alderman Andersen had ~~been~~ agreed to act as care taker of the Playgrounds at a salary of \$ 30.00 per week.

Mr. Louden also advised that Mr. Carol Santes in charge of the County Prison farm stated the Chain Gang force would work on the playgrounds the first, second and third Fridays of February.

A motion by Alderman Lamb seconded by Alderman Blair that a rising vote of thanks be given the outgoing members of the Council ~~has been carried~~ was unanimously carried and a rising vote of thanks was given.

A bill recommended by the Municipal Ass'n; change in revenue from ^{coholic} Alcoholic Beverages ~~and~~ also Beer and Wine, also Tax Collection of Insurance be turned over to Ways and Means committee for their study

A vote of thanks was given Mrs. Eubanks for the past publicity given the City and for her attendance at the meeting of this date.

Mayor Settile stated he would swear in Chief of Police in A.M. Jan. 10th. 1957. Meeting adjourned 9.00 P.M.

act as liaison committee between the City and County and Legislative representatives.

Police committee was instructed to investigate feasibility of erecting a dog
pound and make recommendations.

A resolution was unanimously adopted endorsing petition to have the state pave
two miles of road below 49th street to end of Island and ~~and~~ other connecting streets
and that resolution be mailed to Representative Dangerfield and copies to Senator
Legare Jr. and Representative Grimbill Jr. stating the resolution was a true ~~copy~~ and
correct copy of resolution as passed by the Council Jan. 23rd 1957.

Lempesis, Lamb and Lockard on their conference with the auditors concerning the feasibility of changing our accounting period from a fiscal to a calendar year basis. He reported that so far as the statute is concerned, we are not limited. Corp. Counsellor Bremer confirmed this position. The auditors stated that if the legality of such a change is not challenged, they are in agreement with and will execute any directives issued to them. They are prepared to keep a running statement of our records which can be referred to at any time. Mr. Lempesis advised that in the event Council is advised by the Secretary of State of any legal difficulties in connection with this proposed change, Council can by resolution recommend to the legislature what is needed and approval will be granted in a routine manner.

Motion made by Alderman Dean, seconded by Alderman Anderson:
That the Committee be instructed to tell the auditors it is the intention of the Council to have one yearly audit made as of December 31 with possibly quarterly audits.
Motion carried unanimously.

The question was raised as to whether or not requests for audits on this basis were covered in the present contract with the auditors. While this point was not definitely established, until advised to the contrary by the auditors, it is assumed that the present contract is in force.

SANITATION: Chairman Anderson reported the following items of interest:

A price of 41¢ per gal. had been secured for lubricating oil. (Mr. Lempesis asked if it would be practical to install City service pumps. Mayor Sottile explained that consideration had been given this suggestion, but it was not deemed advisable. He announced that it is the practice to call for bids on a yearly basis on gasoline, oil, tires, etc., and to contract for such items on this basis.)

Cigarettes were distributed to convict labor for services performed.

No further advice on shells for new road at garbage disposal grounds.

Bucket on big truck now operating satisfactorily.

West side of dump needs to be cleaned.

Sand now being put in Blair Memorial Park.

Fogging for mosquitoes continuing as time permits.

Recreation building thoroughly cleaned. Mr. Lamb asked that this be done on a weekly basis. Mr. Anderson advised that it would be done whenever possible.

MAYOR SOTTILE: Reported that work was going forward on the Blair Memorial Park. He offered two concrete benches at no cost. Mr. Sottile advised Council that the Isle of Palms Garden Club had adopted the beautification of City Hall which includes the park adjacent to the building as their long range project.

Motion made by Alderman Lempesis, seconded by Alderman Lamb:
That Mr. Sottile be appointed Council's representative to
work with the Garden Club in the development of this area.
Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Sottile announced that Mr. J. C. Long had offered to
present to the City a portrait of former Mayor Loudon.

Motion made by Alderman Lempesis, seconded by Alderman Lamb:
That Mr. Long's offer of a portrait of former Mayor Loudon
be accepted.
Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Sottile reported that he had advised Mr. Forrest Hudson
of his right to appeal regarding zoning. In substance, he has to make a formal
request to City Council and send a copy to the Zoning Board in order that they
can forward necessary papers to us. It is necessary that Mr. Hudson make an
advance appointment to appear before Council. No further action is necessary
at this time by Council.

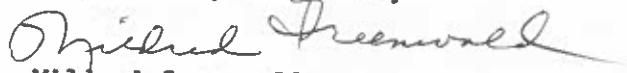
