Report of Ways and Means
Committee on the Budget for
the Fiscal Year 1 9 6 1

Gentlemen:

Before presenting its estimate of Income and Expenses for the year 1961, the Committee would like to review spending during 1960.

In brief, eliminating items not anticipated in the 1960 budget, the total spending for the year was \$44,253.00, the budget for the year was \$41,565.00. Thus the budget was overspent approximately \$2700.00.

Reviewing expenditures for the years 1959-1960, the Committee feels it realistic to estimate operating expenses for 1961 at no less than \$44/45,000.00. Based on a decline in income mainly affecting business license and fines, a realistic estimate of 1961 income would be \$42/43,000.00. Therefore, this Committee recommends that the administration study the income structure early in 1961 to bring income and expenses into closer balance to produce the following return:

Regular meeting City Council, City of Isle of Palms, held December 13, 1961, with Mayor Sottile presiding. Meeting opened with prayer read by Mayor Sottile, followed by silent prayer in memory of Mrs. Wiley G. Horne.

Roll call with following absent: Aldermen Shaffer, Lamb, Rumph, and Corp. Coun. Bremer and Clerk W. G. Horne.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

The following items of correspondence were presented and received as information:

1. Letters regarding Municipal meetings and small town meeting in State.
2. Literature from FHA regarding fallout shelters was turned over to Civil Defense.
3. Letters from Mr. Frank Sottile and Fire Rating Bureau informing Council of reduced insurance rates resulting from new water system.
4. Note of thanks for donation sent Sullivan's Island School last month.
5. Welcome Wagon representative's letter of appreciation for cooperation given her.
6. Request from Australia for information on how to keep beaches clean was turned over to Beach Patrol Comm.

Requests from President of Exchange Club that new street light be installed at new Community Building also request from Mrs. Mary H. Madden that light be installed at 24th & Palm were approved with two lights at Exchange Club area. Oral request relayed from Mr. L. W. Barrett for light to be installed on Charleston Blvd. was denied and Mr. Barrett to be asked to submit written request for same.

Those present unanimously adopted the resolution submitted by letter from Mr. James J. Lamb commending Mayor Sottile for his years of service to City. Also resolution unanimously adopted that similar recognition be given Aldermen Anderson and Lamb.

Letter from Highway Department was read reporting that sand and #9 stone are now stored on Charleston side of Cooper River bridge and will be used if bridge gets iced over.

Mayor Sottile reported conversation held with Mayor Fox of Ravenel and Alderman Hamer reported on his conversation with officials at Folly Beach concerning the Planning Board. Both reports were favorable and Alderman Holman made motion, 2nd by Alderman Hamer that Council make application to Planning Board for Charleston County Planning board to be designated as Planning Board for Isle of Palms. Approved by unanimous vote. Council also voted to join Southern Building Code Congress and clerk instructed to pay \$25.00 fee.

Mayor Sottile stated that the City would need to borrow approximately \$1,000.00 to complete the year; however, he recommended that arrangements be made to borrow up to \$4,000.00 to allow for the new Council's operation in January. Alderman Holman made motion, 2nd by Alderman Chaconas that application be made to First National Bank for loan payable July 1, 1961 at $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ interest. Application agreed to and signed by those present.

All bills ok'd by Ways & Means Comm. ordered paid. Also Christmas Bonuses in the amount of \$145.00 ordered disbursed to City employees as follows: \$25.00 each to W. G. Horne and J. Blair White, \$15.00 each to A. W. Anderson, E. M. Carroll, Mrs. E. A. Bell, John Campbell, Harold White, and Thos. Manigault. \$5.00 to go to Leon Brown.
